# **Grizzly Flats Community Services District** Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board May 9, 2024

### A. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Grizzly Flats CSD Board of Directors was called to order at 6:00 P.M. by Director Hannblom.

### **ROLL CALL OF THE BOARD**

Present: Directors Chigazola, Davidson, Forbey, and Hannblom

Called-in: None

Absent: Director Malonson

Others: Kim Gustafson and Mel Kelley

SALUTE TO THE FLAG was led by Director Hannblom.

- B. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA Director Chigazola made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Director Davidson 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. There was no further discussion. Director Hannblom called for a vote. The motion passed with all directors present voting ave.
- C. PUBLIC COMMENT There were no public comments.
- D. CONSENT CALENDAR- These items are expected to be routine business not normally requiring discussion. Action by the Board was taken at one time with one motion.
  - 1. Approval of the April 11, 2024 regular meeting minutes and April 13, 2024 Public Hearing Minutes.
  - 2. Review monthly System Report for April (production data, rainfall information, operations unrelated to the Caldor Fire Recovery efforts).
  - 3. Approval of the financial reports and spending for April 2024.
  - 4. Receive and file the Quarterly Interest Report from the Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF)- Director Davidson asked Kim Gustafson to investigate other investment options that are FDIC insured.
  - Review and approve purchase of ParcelQuest data for the 2024/2025 tax roll.

Director Chigazola made a motion to approve the consent calendar as presented. Director Davidson 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. There was no further discussion. Director Hannblom called for a vote. The motion passed with all directors present voting aye.

## E. CUSTOMER APPEAL TO THE BOARD

 J. Serota- Customer requested a reversal on late charges - After a brief discussion the Board agreed to stand by the District's existing policy whereby the late fees will not be reversed. Kim Gustafson said she will reach out to the customer with a response.

Director Chigazola made a motion to stand by the existing policy and not take any different action. Director Forbey 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. There was no further discussion. Director Hannblom called for a vote. The motion passed with all directors present voting aye.

### F. OFFICE & FINANACE

# Office Operations:

- 1. Update on maintenance visit for the District's equipment Kim Gustafson said that an employee from HFW Enterprises came up to the District to perform maintenance on the trucks, dump trailer, and generator on April 17, 2024. She indicated that during the work on the Ford Ranger, the technician discovered that a wire was shorting out and melted through the fuel line. He quickly discarded the wire and later returned to replace the damaged fuel line. She said that the total for maintenance labor and parts totaled \$2,053.07. There was a brief discussion about the condition of the District's vehicles. The Board of Directors recommended that staff allocate \$10,000 in the budget to purchase another used vehicle for the District.
- 2. Update for El Dorado Water Agency's Spring Plenary which was held on May 2, 2024 Kim Gustafson

reported that she attended the Spring Plenary wherein various participants were asked to brainstorm funding mechanisms to maintain the value of El Dorado County's recreational features.

# Financial Operations:

- 3. **Update on billing from H2O Urban Solutions, Inc-** Kim Gustafson said billing has been received through 6/30/2023. Although the Operations and Maintenance invoices were paid, there are a few invoices left for engineering and FEMA that will be sorted through and paid within the next couple of weeks. The Board instructed staff not to issue the remaining payments until Scott Myers submits all outstanding invoices.
- 4. Discuss the quarterly statement for the District's California Disaster Loan (CDL) and decide if the balance should be paid off to avoid future interest charges Kim Gustafson said the District received the first quarterly statement for the District's California Disaster Loan (CDL), and \$517.73 interest was assessed for the first draw. Kim requested the Board's approval to pay off the balance of the loan to avoid additional interest fees.

<u>Director Forbey made a motion to authorize the General Manager to pay off the California Disaster Loan.</u>

<u>Director Chigazola 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. There was no further discussion. Director Hannblom called for a vote. The motion passed with all directors present voting aye.</u>

# G. AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) PROJECTS

- 1. Update on the District's ARPA projects –Kim Gustafson said in the next few days, 70% of the plans will be ready for submittal. A deeper test pit was needed for the geo technical team to perform testing of the soil for the new Clearwell tank location. She said the debris survey dive for the reservoir cleaning project was completed, and the liner had much less sediment than expected. The reservoir cleaning project is expected to take two weeks instead of the original estimate of ten weeks. Once the results are in for the soil and sludge tests, the reports and plans for the projects can be completed.
- 2. Present the draft Preliminary Design Report (PDR) to the Board for the Water Treatment Plant Improvements Project- Kim Gustafson presented the draft report to the Board and let them know everything is on schedule.

### H. DISASTER RECOVERY

- 1. Review the most recent Disaster Recovery Status Report Kim Gustafson said District staff is still working with Angel Jimenez (FEMA) to document damages for the water meter and service line project, and that the tanks and booster facilities estimate will be into the Cost Recovery Center (CRC) by Monday to be costed out. She said they are trying to close everything out as soon as possible.
- 2. Review proposals for the Reservoir Liner Repair Project and authorize staff to contract with the most qualified firm Kim Gustafson said the District received one bid from Syblon Reid.

<u>Director Davidson made a motion to award the Reservoir Liner Repair Project contract to Syblon Reid for a not-to-exceed total of \$153,375. Director Chigazola 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. There was no further discussion. Director Hannblom called for a vote. The motion passed with all directors present voting aye.</u>

- ANNOUNCEMENTS / DIRECTORS COMMENTS Kim Gustafson said the Budget and Finance Committee meeting and a special meeting will be scheduled for June.
- J. ADJOURNMENT <u>Director Chigazola made a motion to adjourn. Director Davidson 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. There was no further discussion. Director Hannblom called for a vote. The motion passed with all directors present voting aye and the meeting was adjourned at 7:34 P.M.</u>

# A RESOLUTION OF THE GRIZZLY FLATS COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT, ADJUSTING THE CAPITAL CONNECTION CHARGE FOR WATER SERVICE TO NEW CUSTOMERS

WHEREAS, the Grizzly Flats Community Services District ("the District") is a Community Services District located within the County of El Dorado and is organized and operating pursuant to Government Code 61000, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. L87-16 of the Local Agency Formation Commission of the County of El Dorado adopted on August 19, 1987, the Grizzly Flats Community Services District ("District") was formed to provide water services to the residents and businesses of Grizzly Flats; and

**WHEREAS**, under California Water Code Sections 71613-71617, a municipal water district is authorized to fix rates and charges for the water it delivers; and

WHEREAS, under California Water Code Section 61115(a), the District is authorized to establish rates or other charges for services and facilities that the District supplies and to provide for the collection and enforcement of those rates or other charges; and

WHEREAS, under California Government Code Section 66000 et seq., municipal water districts and community services districts (such as the District) are deemed local agencies that are authorized to adopt water capacity fees; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 66013(a) states that "[n]otwithstanding any other provision of law, when a local agency imposes fees for water connections or sewer connections, or imposes capacity charges, those fees or charges shall not exceed the estimated reasonable cost of providing the service for which the fee or charge is imposed..."; and

WHEREAS, the District wishes to increase its water capacity fee in the manner set forth in Section 5 of the Utility Rates and Fees Study, dated February 12, 2024, prepared by Hansford Economic Consulting LLC ("Water Rate Study"), that is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and is incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the revenue raised by the increased capacity fees will be used to pay for current and future District facilities that new customers benefit from and will use such as distribution pipes, tanks, the water treatment plant, and equipment used to service the water system(s), and land; and

WHEREAS, the establishment, modification, structuring, restructuring, and approval of rates and fees is exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act as provided by California Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(8); and

WHEREAS, the amount of the fees and charges hereby adopted do not exceed the reasonable anticipated costs for the corresponding services provided by the District, and therefore the fees imposed hereby do not qualify as "special taxes" under Government Code Section 50076, and the actions taken herein are exempt from the additional notice and public meeting requirements of the Brown Act pursuant to Government Code Section 54954.6(a)(1)(A) and (B); and

WHEREAS, the fees and charges set forth herein are not levied upon any person as an incident of property ownership, and thus are not subject to the substantive and procedural prerequisites of Article XIIID of the California Constitution.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GRIZZLY FLATS COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT, after conducting a public hearing duly noticed pursuant to California Government Code Section 660126, as follows:

- 1. The public interest and necessity as described in the oral and written testimony and evidence presented during the public hearing on this matter, all of which are incorporated herein by this reference, requires the Board of Directors of the District to approve the Water Rates Study and modify the District's water capacity fee as follows:
  - a. The amount of the District's water capacity fee is hereby increased as set forth in Table 20 of the Study.
  - b. The water service capacity charge is the charge for the type and size of water service connection desired. Such charges shall be paid in advance by the applicant along with any other related costs prior to installation of a new service connection.
- 2. The District's General Manager is hereby authorized to take any and all actions necessary to carry out the intent of the District's Board of Directors as is stated herein and as otherwise required in order to comply with applicable law.
- 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption and shall supersede all previous capacity fee increases.



# **SECTION 5:** CAPACITY FEES CALCULATIONS

# 5.1 AUTHORITY TO CHARGE CAPACITY FEES

Under the authority of the Mitigation Fee Act (1987), contained in California Government Code Section 66000 et. seq., the Agency is authorized to collect water capacity and connection fees. When a municipality adopts or updates a capacity or connection fee, it must demonstrate that the fee shall not exceed the estimated reasonable cost of providing the service for which the fee is imposed. Maximum justifiable fees are calculated in this report pursuant to demonstration of the nexus between the total amount of development at buildout of GFCSD's service area, and infrastructure capacity required to serve buildout development.

The District may impose a capacity fee pursuant to Government Code Section 66013(b)(3) for:

- (a) public facilities in existence at the time a charge is imposed (a "buy-in" fee) and/or
- (b) charges for new public facilities to be acquired or constructed in the future that are of proportional benefit to the person or property being charged (a "new facilities" fee).

The fee may include supply or capacity contracts for rights or entitlements, real property interest, and entitlements and other rights of the local agency involving capital expense relating to use of its existing and/or new public facilities. The capacity fee should be evaluated at least every five years; over time, inflationary adjustments to fees alone may be insufficient as development plans change, anticipated pace of development changes, and infrastructure solutions to service provision are revised.

The District may also impose a connection fee pursuant to Government Code Section 66013 (b)(5) for the physical facilities necessary to make a water connection, including, but not limited to, meters, meter boxes, and pipelines from the structure or project to a water distribution line, that does not exceed the estimated reasonable cost of labor and materials for installation of those facilities. Currently, the District has fees for new service installation but in practicality does not charge it because the District requires a contractor to install the facilities for the owner with inspection of the facilities by District staff upon completion. The District may supply materials, in which case, the actual costs of the materials are charged to the new customer.

It is recommended that the District update its hook-up and new service installation fees to describe the current system as one of reimbursement for actual costs and inspection time. This Study only updates the water capacity fee, which is currently charged at \$6,030 per ERU.

# 5.2 METHODOLOGY

The water capacity fee is calculated using the buy-in approach so that customers pay a fee that reflects the value of the existing water capacity. The methodology for calculating the water capacity fee is summarized below:

- 1. Identify existing and future capacity, expressed in Equivalent Residential Units (ERUs).
- 2. Determine the total cost of facilities and equipment to be included in the fee calculation using District asset records. The existing assets are estimated to be sufficient to serve the buildout of GFCSD's service territory<sup>2</sup>; however, there are many assets that must be replaced because they were destroyed, or partially destroyed, by the Caldor Fire.
- 3. Add the cost of infrastructure improvements to be completed in the current fiscal year (before the new fees are implemented) and add the cost of land. Deduct other revenue sources (developer contributions, grants, and property taxes for example) as credits to the total cost of facilities. Deduct outstanding principal on debt still to be repaid. Add the costs developed in steps 2 and 3 to determine the total cost basis.
- 4. Adjust the total cost basis by adding unrestricted cash reserves in the water fund as of June 30, 2023. Add a 3% administration charge for studies to update the capacity fee, and District staff time spent on the capacity fee program. This step determines the **total buy-in cost basis**.
- 5. Divide the **total buy-in cost basis** by the number of ERUs that can be served by the water system infrastructure to calculate the update water capacity fee per ERU.

Capacity fees are charged to pay for current and future District facilities that new customers benefit from and will use. Capacity fees pay for major infrastructure such as distribution pipes, tanks, and the water treatment plant, equipment used to service the water system(s), and land.

# **Water System Capacity**

The first step in determining capacity fees is establishing capacity of the water system expressed in ERUs. Prior to the Caldor Fire, the water system could serve the District's entire service territory. While certain facilities were aging and needed replacement, there was no need to increase capacity of the system. Capacity fees had been paid for properties with structures on their property; some of which had structures that were destroyed by the Caldor Fire. The total number of ERUs that had paid capacity fees prior to the Caldor Fire, plus properties that will have paid capacity fees by the end of fiscal year 2024, is estimated

to be 597 ERUs. It is estimated that at buildout of the service territory, GFCSD will serve 1,235 ERUs, as shown in Table 20.

### 5.3 **TOTAL BUY-IN COST BASIS**

### Value of Current Assets

There are five different options (methodologies) that could be used in the valuation of existing assets to establish the buy-in cost basis. Supporting Table A-8 in Appendix A provides the list of water system assets upon which the valuation calculation under each of the options is based.

The five valuation options are generated by the treatment of the value of the assets. Options 1 and 2 use the original cost approach where the buy-in fee reflects the original investment in existing capacity, paying an amount similar to what the existing customers paid for the capacity (or the remaining value of the original investments). A concern with this approach is that it is impractical because insufficient capital is raised to ensure longevity of the asset. This approach is rarely used.

 Option 1 bases the buy-in fee on the original cost of the assets (when it was purchased or constructed).

<sup>[1]</sup> Existing capacity of properties that have paid capacity fees, not the capacity currently being used.

Option 2 bases the buy-in fee on the net book value of the District's assets. This
methodology is based on an accounting perspective that depreciates the original
cost of the assets and assumes that anything beyond its theoretical useful life no
longer has any value to new customers.

Most water capacity fee studies calculate the buy-in fee using a replacement cost methodology (Option 3). Under this approach, all the agency's current assets are valued at the current cost to replace them. This methodology is very appropriate for GFCSD because the water system was partially destroyed in the Caldor Fire, but it had sufficient capacity prior to the fire to serve the entire service territory at buildout.

The replacement cost approach can also be modified to deduct depreciation from the value of the assets using a straight-line depreciation methodology on either the replacement cost or the original cost of the assets<sup>3</sup>.

- Option 4 only accounts for the value of assets that still have a useful life (in theory) by deducting the replacement cost depreciation.
- Option 5 recognizes the actual depreciation that has been accounted for on the
  District's books (based on original cost), and that existing customers have paid for to
  date. Under this option, assets that have in theory exceeded their useful life may
  still have a value associated with them that new development would pay for a
  portion of.

While all five approaches to setting the buy-in fee are legitimate approaches described in both the American Water Works Association M1 Manual, **Option 5 is recommended as the most appropriate given the current state of the District's water system.** This approach recognizes the cost of providing capacity to customers as if the capacity were added at the time it was needed for new growth and it compensates the existing customers for carrying costs of excess capacity to date. In addition, while many of the District's assets have theoretically exceeded their useful life, they are in fact perfectly capable of performing as required.

The recommended buy-in cost basis is \$9.4 million.

### Additions and Deduction to Value of Assets

The estimated cost of assets that will be rehabilitated or replaced in fiscal year 2024, prior to the updated fee implementation, is added. The cost of land is also added. Grant-funded portions of assets are removed, as are contributed capital (assets that were built by a private party and dedicated to the District). Outstanding principal on the USDA loan is also deducted because when new customers become rate-paying customers, they will pay for debt in their rates.

### The subtotal cost basis is \$9.1 million.

## **Adjustments**

Adjustments to the cost basis include addition of unrestricted cash reserves and administration costs.

- Unrestricted cash reserves were \$1.0 million as of June 30, 2023.
- An administrative fee of three percent of the cost basis is added for collection and handling of the fees, public hearing costs<sup>4</sup>, and periodic updates of the fee program.

The capacity fee total buy-in cost basis with adjustments is \$10.5 million.

## 5.4 CAPACITY FEES CALCULATION

The total buy-in cost basis is divided by the estimated total number of ERUs that the District can serve with its infrastructure (once the portion of the system that was destroyed by the Caldor Fire has been restored). The fee calculation is shown in **Table 21**.

The recommended fee increases the District's current capacity fee from \$6,030 to \$8,485 per ERU.

In accordance with changes to California law in recent years, it is recommended that all residential units pay the capacity fee on a per building square foot basis. Creation of ADUs is permitted by California law on all residential and mixed-use zoned properties. Per Government Code 65852.2, capacity fees for ADUs must be charged on a per building square foot or fixture unit basis. Capacity fees for attached ADUs (and Junior ADUs) may only be charged if the unit is constructed with a new single-family home. A new detached ADU may be charged a capacity fee whenever it is built.

To establish the water capacity fee on a building square foot basis, the fee per ERU is divided by the typical size of a home in the District's service territory. The typical size of a home is calculated as the median of permanent single-family homes in the District's service territory as of June 2023. It is 1,596 building square feet.

The calculated updated water capacity fee by new development land use type is shown in **Table 22.**

# 5.5 CAPACITY FEE ADOPTION AND FUTURE ADJUSTMENTS

Pursuant to California Government Code 66016, prior to increasing an existing fee or adopting a new fee, an agency must hold at least one open and public meeting. Notice of the time and place of the meeting, including a general explanation of the matter to be considered, and a statement that all supporting studies and information are available to the public, shall be noticed at least 10 days prior to the meeting. Increases to an existing fee or adoption of a new fee may be made by ordinance or resolution.

It is recommended that the District update the Water Capacity Fee every January 1 based on the change in the San Francisco Engineering News-Record Construction Cost Index for the previous 12 months November to November period. Periodic review of the Water Capacity Fee is also recommended whenever estimated costs are revised pursuant to an update of the District's Water Master Plan, or whenever there are land use changes made by El Dorado County that would affect projected growth in the District's service territory.

# 5.6 MITIGATION FEE ACT COMPLIANCE

The District must deposit capacity fee revenues in a separate Capacity Fees Fund to avoid any comingling with other monies of the District. Any interest income earned must also be deposited into the Capacity Fees Fund. In addition, the District must comply with annual and five-year reporting requirements for the Capacity Fees Fund.

Within 180 days of the end of a fiscal year, the following is to be furnished for the prior fiscal year:

- 1. A description of the charges deposited in the fund,
- 2. The beginning and ending balance of the fund,
- 3. The amount of the fees collected, and interest earned,
- 4. An identification of each public improvement for which fees were expended and the amount of expenditure for each improvement, including the percentage of the total cost of the improvement that was funded with capacity fees if more than one source of funding was used,
- 5. An identification of each public improvement on which charges were expended that were completed during the fiscal year, and each improvement anticipated to be undertaken in the following fiscal year, and
- 6. A description of any interfund transfer or loan made from the Capacity Fee Fund, identification of any public improvements on which any transferred monies are, or will be, expended, and a description of repayment terms.

All the above information may be included in the District's annual financial report.



#### 1 INTRODUCTION

Grizzly Flats Community Services District ("District") hired Kier + Wright to conduct a debris survey of their 31-acre raw water reservoir. The District intends to use the information revealed through this effort to prepare the Scope of Work and Contract for a future cleaning project. The purpose of the debris survey was to determine the existing amount and type of debris present. It is understood that the buildup of sediment and debris, especially the accumulation of organic matter, can impact the water quality affecting taste and odor for water customers.

#### 1.1 BACKGROUND

Kier + Wright understands that the District has not cleaned the reservoir since the installation of their HDPE textile fabric liner in 2012. The reservoir was inspected in 2017 by the commercial dive group, Inland Potable Services, Inc. (IPS). IPS observed the buildup of sediment across the reservoir bottom as mostly occurring around the perimeter. IPS observed a sediment layer 8 inches in depth (on average) around the perimeter extending 12 inches towards the center. The flat floor surface was found with approximately 0.5 inches of decaying plant material with a spongy, sticky consistency. Both the inlet and outlet were found in good condition with minor sediment staining. The sediment found around the inlet was a finer consistency and was approximately 0.5 inches deep. The sloped shoreline walls were found with an average of 0.25 inches of sediment.

Given the impact of the 2021 Caldor Fire and changes to the contributing watershed, the sediment amount and characteristics were assumed to have changed since the IPS inspection in 2017. Recognizing the evolving conditions and the need to address potential impacts to their water quality, the District recognized a new survey was necessary to accurately assess the current state of the reservoir.

#### 2 SURVEY

Kier + Wright's approach to the reservoir survey involved our survey team working in tandem with a dive crew. The divers collected 10 sediment samples in locations spread evenly across the reservoir to capture potentially variable sediment characteristics and to form a comprehensive picture of the sediment present. Numerical ID tags, 1-10, were placed on 1-gallon sampling containers and the divers were directed by a team member on shore to each sampling location. Appendix A provides a topographic map of the reservoir and includes the numerical tags for each sampling location.

The sample containers were large enough to collect samples to conduct multiple tests. For each collected sample, a portion of the sediment was transferred into a separate container to undergo jar testing. The purpose of jar testing was to test different coagulant types to determine the best type and dosage for settling the finer sediment material. The sediment samples that remained after jar testing were delivered and analyzed by the Geocon Consultants, Inc. laboratory.

# 3 CONCLUSION

The sediment coverage in the reservoir was less than anticipated. The overall amount appeared comparable to the findings presented by IPS in their 2017 inspection report. However, our divers observed the majority of the sediment concentrated around the inlet, in an area approximately 980 square feet (sqft.). The area was shaped like an ellipse, approximately 25 feet wide and 50' long with the length side extending towards the center of the reservoir. Within this area, Kier + Wright observed




sediment piles ranging from 8 to 12 inches thick. Despite its thickness, the sediment was easily disturbed by the diver's touch. Twigs and pine needles were found all around the inlet and scattered sporadically elsewhere in the reservoir, with no large tree branches sighted. The sediment depth tapered off beyond this elliptical area to a more consistent layering.


The flat floor bottom was covered with sediment approximately 0.5 to 0.75 inch deep with sporadic mounding 1 to 1.5 inches thick. This type of layering was observed across the flat floor bottom and extending partially up the perimeter side walls. Along the sidewalls, the divers observed increased sediment buildup, which they called a 'bathtub ring', approximately 10 to 15 feet wide and 1 to 1.25 inches deep. Past this "bathtub ring" extending to the water's edge roughly 5 feet, the sediment layering became minimal - 0.25 to 0.5 inches thick. The overall sediment composition was found to be very light (almost suspended) material, easily disturbed by the touch.


The divers did not observe rips or tears in the HDPE liner. Although, the visibility was severely limited, with the bottom being mostly obscured by sediment. The divers noted instances where the liner seams were visible and appearing in good condition. Appendix B provides the underwater pictures that were taken. A short description is included below each picture detailing the approximate location where it was taken referencing the sample ID tags shown in Appendix A.

Due to the sediment's light/suspended nature, the survey crew struggled to gather accurate measurements of the sediments surface that aligned with the divers' observations. Despite the divers' efforts to assist, especially in the area around the inlet with 8 to 12-inches of a sediment, the survey rod consistently plunged straight to the bottom without registering any sensation to the crew. Ultimately, the survey crew was unable to generate a sediment surface profile to overlay the topographic survey results using a measuring stick. The Survey team relied on diver observations to calculate a sediment surface. The total sediment is estimated to be ~240 cubic yards. This accounts for 12 inches of sediment within the 980 sqft elliptical area around the inlet, 1.5 inches of sediment within the 15-foot-wide perimeter 'bathtub ring', and 0.5 inches of sediment everywhere else.

Appendix C presents the results of the laboratory analysis, revealing the percentage of organic matter and particle distribution for each sample. Note each sample tag corresponds to the ID tag mapped in Appendix A. The results are also depicted graphically in the Figures below. The analysis indicates that the sediment is mostly finer material. Of particular concern to the District is the high level of organic content, which poses a risk to the water quality and may affect taste and odor.











Jar testing was scheduled to take place following the sample collection. Northstar Chemicals provided two types of coagulants/polymers for testing. However, it was deemed unnecessary to introduce chemical coagulants into the future cleaning project due to the fast settling rate of material in the samples. District Engineer Cort Abney expressed concern about unnecessarily complicating the cleaning effort, potentially dissuading contractors. Therefore, the decision was made to forego jar testing, given the observed sediment.

### 4 RECOMMENDATIONS


Based on our findings, we recommend a cleanup project that focuses on the ~980 sqft. elliptical area surrounding the inlet where sediment depths have reached 8 to 12 inches and also the perimeter 'bathtub ring' with approximate sediment depths ranging between 1 to 1.5 inches. We suggest engaging a contractor to perform a dredging operation and using baker tanks to settle out the sediment before returning clean water back to the reservoir.










# GRIZZLY FLATS CSD DISASTER STATUS REPORT



Date: June 13, 2024

General: The purpose of Status Reporting is to provide current information to District staff, administration, and elected officials of ongoing progress on water service and infrastructure restoration. The Status Report will be updated on a regular basis and as information critical to restoration of the water system becomes available.

#### **CURRENT STATUS**

# **Situation Summary**

- Eagle Ditch Tree Felling Project Five (5) proposals were received for Phase 1 (units C, D, E, and F), and will be presented to the Board at the June 13, 2024 meeting so that a contract can be awarded.
- Insurance and FEMA funding for the reservoir liner repair project has been received by GFCSD. The Board awarded the bid to Syblon Reid on May 9, 2024. Work is expected to begin within the next few weeks, and to conclude prior to August 30, 2024.
- District staff continues work with Angel Jimenez at FEMA to get undeveloped projects obligated.
- On May 22, 2014, staff held an online meeting with Angel Jimenez, four CalOES personnel, and a team of six personnel from EHP to discuss environmental concerns for the outstanding fire related projects. Prior to moving forward, EHP will require a long list of information as well as permits that ensure all federal environmental concerns are adequately addressed prior to approving the projects. Of concern is a Foothill yellow-legged frog habitat which is located near the diversions on USFS land.
- District staff continue regular bi-weekly meetings with Insurance Co. Staff continues negotiations with the insurance company to bring the Tanks and Booster Station project costs closer to the estimates of H2Ou and FEMA. Another call is scheduled to take place on June 18, 2024.
- Severe storms of December 2022 Staff will not request replacement of the Programmable Logic Controller with this funding, but rather will submit 50% of H2Ou's operations costs incurred while manually treating water for reimbursement under this project.

NTS has completed a multitude of similar projects, ranging from 5 acres to 5,000 acres, from residential property clearing for new construction and fire breaks to Transmission Right-of-Way land clearing and forest fuels reduction. NTS has a vast understanding of various scopes of work that include the proposed Scope of Work in this RFP, including but not limited to the following:

NTS is currently working with several clients through the Sierra Nevada region to eliminate high hazard trees including dead and dying conifers, fire ravaged forests, extreme fire fuel unloading and fire break creation and maintenance as well as utility clearances for water, power and gas distribution agencies and companies.

NTS employs tree fellers and groundmen with decades of knowledge in forest fuels reduction and tree felling expertise. These employees are trained and equipped with up-to-date techniques and equipment to safely remove the high hazard trees from within striking distance to the underground water conveyance piping. This equipment will include jacks and pulley systems to safely direct all tree felling activities away from Districts infrastructure to include all underground piping, Air/Vacuum Release stations, vent piping and or metering boxes. The teams will assess each tree and the surrounding area and develop a plan to best address the local hazards.

Upon Contract Award, NTS will submit a schedule to the district which will lay out the felling plan and duration for the awarded units. Whether awarded one or more units, NTS is prepared to staff each unit with the appropriate manpower and equipment to complete the project within the 90-calendar day duration.

NTS has developed its proposal anticipating for the award for all four units. This project proposal assumes that if the District were to award all units to NTS the cost savings would benefit the entire project by not having multiple contractors scheduling work near the others. NTS would systematically work through the units in a controlled manner by placing crews at safe felling distances from each other. NTS will start three felling crews on units C, D and F. In order to keep safe distance from the opposing crews they will work in the same direction from upstream to downstream of each unit. After completing Unit D, the crew will work into Unit E. Because of the potential tree strike where these units wrap around the hillside and in close proximity to each other, NTS feels that these two units must be worked as one.

As another way to control costs to the District, NTS will deploy two 2-person cleanup crews to include a small, tracked excavator with a grabble bucket to buck and remove all slash and tree boles from within the District's Water Conveyance Right of Way. Having one contractor complete all 4 phases of cleanup work eliminates the need to equipment multiple contractor teams with redundant equipment for the clearing task.

NTS is committed to starting the project with full crews within 2 weeks of the Contract Award and Notice to Proceed.

NTS is proposing to commit 3 crews to this project. Each crew will be comprised of 1 Skilled Feller and 1 ground worker. Each crew will be equipped with gas-powered chainsaws, jacks and 5 to 1 pulley systems to safely fell all previuoly marked high hazard trees from within the project boundaries.

After progression of the tree felling crews NTS will then focus on clearing the Right of Way of all slash and tree boles and stacking of the associated slash.

If any areas of concern including biological, cultural, or otherwise are encountered, the crew will stop work and report the findings to the District. At this point the crew will delineate the area and move along the Right of Way.

NTS will set up the project staging/lay down area near the project entrance on Capps Crossing Road. The workers will attend a site safety and daily objective briefing before signing into and out of the controlled work areas each day.

In order to keep the District informed of the project progress, NTS will employ an onsite Superintendent to track daily progress, record completed sections and submit a daily report detailing the project specific goals. This report will contain the number of estimated trees completed per unit, inspection data, issues encountered and resolutions, photos of progress as well as schedule updates and production progression. The report will be updated and emailed to all stakeholders daily. The Superintendent will also be in charge of all Quality Control and communications with all stakeholders.

The Site Superintendent will also be the Safety Officer in charge of all on-site training and OSHA compliance. Because of the remote working location NTS will deploy cellular communications with both AT&T and Verizon connectivity. NTS will have a full complement of first aid supplies to care for worker injuries. This equipment includes 3 full trauma first aid kits as well as a backboard stretcher with neck and spine immobilizer, blood stop kits, tourniquet supplies and a mobile helicopter landing pad. In the event of an injury the worker will be assessed and given first aid and either treated on site or transported to the medical center for further treatment depending on severity of the injury. If an Air Ambulance is called the helipad will be deployed in the immediate area and the injured worker will be stabilized for transport.

Upon Contract Award NTS will contact Mercy Hospital of Folsom, in Folsom, CA and make them aware of the project and possible injury/illnesses they will be dealing with. Mercy Hospital will be given the Latitude and Longitude (38.640057, -120.501699) of the lay down area along with site specific access maps, directions, and communication protocols. Before mobilizing to the project Mercy Hospital will be given a full list of the workers' names, blood types and any known illness or allergy information. They will also be given our BK radio frequency information to connect with the Site Superintendent in the event of an Air or Ground Ambulance medivac emergency. Once enroute and within range of the BK radios the ambulance service will be given the exact location of the injured worker and directed into the mobile helipad or the lay down area for transportation to the hospital.

All the crew members have extensive forest knowledge and the ability to confidently identify tree and brush species, botanical, biological and cultural resources. The crews will adhere to any avoidance area

flagging. If any resource is encountered outside of the flagged area the crews will stop work and immediately notify the District prior to operations in the area resuming.



- e. Protected Areas USFS and its contractors may be working in the area concurrently with the Phase I work. USFS personnel may mark areas of special interest as sensitive or protected with flagging or signs. If areas are marked by USFS as sensitive or protected, Contractor shall avoid felling trees in those areas.
- f. Live Trees Some trees currently marked as mortally damaged from fire may survive. The USFS will evaluate said marked trees and paint any trees it determines worth saving with orange paint over the previous marking. Contractor shall leave said marked trees in place.

# GRIZZLY FLATS COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT EAGLE DITCH TREE FELLING PROJECT WORK PLAN

#### 1. Crew Size

 A 2 person crew will be used in most cases, for both safety and efficiency. A tree feller and helper will be part of this crew.

#### 2. Equipment

 Equipment will include 4X4 pickup trucks outfitted with fire suppression equipment, chain saws, jacks, ropes, and other items needed to perform the operation. Small equipment may be deployed primarily to assist with clearing and maintaining roadways open, and may include a mini-excavator, skid steer, mini skid steer and chippers.

#### 3. Sanitary Program

 Sanitation of tools and equipment will occur if transitioning from dead/dying trees to trimming live/leave trees. We do not anticipate this to occur due to the scope of work.

#### 4. Hazardous Materials Plan

• Not used/not intended. UTS crews do receive OHSA required training for hazmat identification and response.

#### 5. Signage Program

 All signs for tree felling operations will be in compliance with the Sign and Poster Guidelines for the Forest Service, USFS, Revised October 2013 (Reference Chapters 2, 3 and 4). Additionally, all traffic control will comply with standards set forth in the MUTCD.

#### 6. Schedule

 Following contract award, UTS will mobilize resources within 14 days. We anticipate the project to take 30-90 days depending on which and how many lots are awarded.

#### 7. RPF Forester Oversight

- Project oversight will be provided by Mike Powers, RPF #2690 (ISA Cert Arborist with Tree Risk Assessment Qualification (TRAQ))
- Pre-Operations Meeting and project walk will be held prior to work on the project.
- RPF oversight will occur at a frequency of 1-2 days/week during operations field visits and review of work.
- The RPF will be available to answer questions and respond to issues.

#### 8. Completion Documentation and Communication to CSD

- Completed work will be documented and reported back to the CSD weekly. Reporting to
  include QA/QC reassurance, number of trees felled, compliance with scope
  requirements, observed or encountered issues, questions regarding tree marking, etc.
  Use of a field form such as Survey 123 will be utilized to document completed work.
- Progress reports will be submitted to the CSD weekly.

#### 9. Trees Identified for Felling

- Trees marked for felling will be reviewed and confirmed.
- · Trees marked will be reviewed for project scope prior to felling by RPF/Certified arborist.
- Changes in tree health are possible since the initial tree inspection and marking effort.
   Prior to felling the project area will be inspected for additional mortality and/or improvement of tree health and observed changes will be reported to the CSD.

#### 10. Progression of Tree Felling

- Work will progress in the most efficient manner depending upon site conditions, access and other factors
- Tree felling sequence will progress to minimize damage to retained tress, resources and consider safety and protection of facilities.
- Trees with a natural fall lean or weight away from the facility and/or a protected resource will be free felled. Trees without a natural lean or canopy weight away from protected facilities and/or resources may have a head rope secured into the tree to aid in the direction of intended fall, or be jacked over.
- Stump heights shall be 12" or less above the uphill side ground level of the stump.

#### 11. Resource Protection Measures (Watercourse Protection and Erosion Control)

- Identified watercourse will be provided protection measures consistent with FPR 14 CCR
   956.4. Watercourse and protection zones will be identified in the field with flagging.
- Where feasible trees will be directionally felled away from identified watercourse and flagged WLPZs. If trees must be felled in the direction of a watercourse, the trunk will suspend the bed, bank and channel and any debris deposited into the channel will be removed within 24 hours of occurrence.
- Any unintentional felled trees into a watercourse channel will be removed by hand within 24 hours of occurrence.
- Soil disturbance as a result of tree felling operations shall be treated for reduction of soil loss. Contiguous areas greater then 20x20' or 400 sq.ft. will be covered with felled tree slash lopped to the ground for erosion control. Minimal coverage of 50% disturbed soil area.
- As a general practice felled tree slash (limbs and tops) will be lopped and scattered to the greatest extent possible and utilized as ground cover for erosion control.

#### 12. Hazard Reduction Mitigation of Slash

- Felled tree slash shall be treated consistent with FPR 14 CCR 957.2. Treatment of Slash to Reduce Fire Hazard.
- At a minimum slash generated as a result of felling of marked trees will be treated as follows:
  - a) Within 100 feet of edge of traveled surface of a public road and within 50 feet of edge of a traveled surface of permanent/seasonal road slash shall be treated by lopping and scattering.



- b) Within 100 feet of a permanently located structure maintained for human habitation all slash greater then one inch but less then eight inches in diameter shall be removed. All slash between 100-200 feet of permanently located structure maintained for human habitation shall be lopped for fire hazard reduction, removed or chipped.
- c) Lopping shall consist of severing limbs from the exposed sides of the unutilized portions of trees so that portions of severed limbs are in contact with the ground. Lopping for Fire Hazard Reduction means severing and spreading slash so that no part of it generally remains more than 30 inches above the ground.

#### 13. Removal of Felled Trees from Roadways

- Trees felled that fall into a traveled roadway will be removed the same day to maintain roadway access.
- Small equipment may be utilized to remove tree trunks and slash from roadway.
- Resulting woody debris will be placed outside of the roadway prism and scattered as to no concentrate.
- Equipment shall be restricted to the maintained existing roadway prism and shoulder.

## 14. Protection of Facilities and Safety Program

- All reasonable measures for the protection of the districts facilities shall be taken.
   Consideration shall be given for tree felling direction, potential for log roll, limb fall, etc.
- Felled trees will be bucked to the ground to ensure that the tree trunk is stable and unable to roll.
- Tree felling operations shall follow all fire prevention rules consistent with FPR 14 CCR 958, 958.1, 958.4, 958.6, 958.8 and PRC 4427, 4428, 4431 and 4442.
- Fire prevention rules will be discussed during the pre-operations meeting and rules will be posed at the project/work sites.
- Temporary traffic control will be needed in places where tree felling a near and adjacent to open roads. Traffic control and site safety will close or flag the roads during operations and removal of woody debris for short durations and reopen when safe.
- Large 3x3' signs will be place at least 500' or greater then two tree lengths on either side of active tree felling operations to warn the public of tree felling danger. Signs shall comply with the "standards for Forest Service signs and posters".
